## Edgeley High School <br> Idea: Selling Christmas Wreaths <br> \# of people needed: 10-15 (each selling a certain amount determined by adviser) How it's accomplished: 1. Reach out to local plant nursery and calculate price 2. Create order forms 3. Have each member sell 4. (Optional) Incentivize by paying SLC fees for members who reach threshold!

How it's spread: Flyers, Facebook, School Newspaper, etc.

\# of people needed: As many as needed to sell raffle tickets
How it's accomplished: FBLA members sell raffle tickets to members of the community
How it's spread: Facebook, Daily Announcements

Idea: Concessions
\# of people needed: All who are available
How it's accomplished: Buy, prepare, and serve food at community events How it's spread: Posters, Social Media

How it's spread: Flyers, Facebook, School Newspaper, etc.
